- **Wynwood**: I loved the artsy vibe and cheap eats nearby. Great for young travelers.
- **Brickell**: Perfect for city lovers. I hopped on the free Metro Mover to explore.
- North Beach: Super chill with calm beaches. I saw families relaxing here.

Budgets (3 Nights):

- **Solo**: \$60–\$165 (hostel dorms) or \$180–\$330 (hotels/Airbnbs).
- **Couple**: \$213–\$390 (hotels/Airbnbs).
- Family (4): \$240–\$420 (hotels/Airbnbs).

Tip: Book on Booking.com or blurentals.com 2–3 months early for deals. Families try Selina Miami River (\$90–\$140 for private rooms/suites) in Little Havana for extra space.

4 Where to Eat: Authentic & Cheap Local Spots

- **Coyo Taco**: The \$5 elote was a highlight. Tacos are \$9–\$13, but check for happy hour deals.
- Wynwood Marketplace: Food trucks had \$5 tacos that were super tasty.

Budgets (3 Days):

• **Solo**: \$15–\$25/day. Total: \$45–\$75.

• **Couple**: \$30–\$50/day. Total: \$90–\$150.

• Family (4): \$60-\$100/day. Total: \$180-\$300.

Tip: Avoid Ocean Drive (meals \$20+). Stick to Little Havana or Wynwood for cheap eats. Check wynwood-marketplace.com for food truck schedules.

- Miami Beach Trolley: I rode this free shuttle to South Beach daily—so easy!
- Metro Mover: Free downtown rides saved me cash.
- Metrobus/Metrorail: A \$5.65 day pass got me everywhere.
- Citi Bike: Biking North Beach for \$4.50 was awesome.

Budgets (3 Days):

• **Solo**: \$5–\$10/day. Total: \$15–\$30.

• Couple: \$10-\$20/day. Total: \$30-\$60.

• **Family (4)**: \$20–\$40/day. Total: \$60–\$120.

Tip: Use the free MIA Mover to Metrorail (\$2.25) for airport transfers instead of \$30 taxis. Solo travelers use Uber for late nights (\$10–\$15).

7 Hidden Fees to Avoid (Resort Charges, Parking, Tipping)

Miami can sneak in extra costs if you're not careful. I learned to dodge these to keep my trip cheap. Here's what to watch for in 2025:

- **Resort Charges**: Some hotels add \$20–\$40/day for "amenities" like Wi-Fi. I chose YVE Hotel Miami with no resort fees. Check fine print on Booking.com.
- **Parking**: South Beach parking costs \$20–\$40/day. I walked or used free trolleys to avoid it.
- **Tipping**: Restaurants expect 15–20% tips (\$~\$2–\$3 per \$10 meal). I budgeted for tips at sit-down spots but skipped them at food trucks.

Tip: Ask hotels about fees before booking. Use Hotels.com for "no resort fee" deals.

Table 5: Daily Budget Breakdown for Solo Travelers in Miami (2025)

- \$50/Day: Ideal for backpackers. I stayed in a \$20 dorm, ate \$5 tacos, and enjoyed free spots like South Beach. Couples double this (\$100/day); families multiply by 4 (\$200/day for 4).
- **\$100/Day**: More comfort! I upgraded to a hotel, had sit-down meals, and tried a paid attraction. Couples share a room (\$71–\$130), so \$130–\$200/day total; families budget \$300–\$350/day for 4.

3-Day Totals (Solo):

- **\$50/Day**: \$~\$150 (excluding flights).
- \$100/Day: \$~\$300 (excluding flights).

Flights: Budget \$100–\$250 (solo), \$200–\$500 (couple), \$400–\$1,000 (family of 4).

Tip: Mix free activities with cheap eats to save. Follow @VisitMiami on X for deals.
