### Is Tulum safe for tourists?

Yes, Tulum is generally **safe for tourists**. The most common issues are **petty theft** (like items left unattended on the beach) and natural hazards (like strong ocean currents). Use common sense: don't flash **expensive jewelry**, use hotel safes, and always heed **warning flags** at the beach and cenotes. Stick to well-traveled areas, especially at night.

### What is the best time to visit Tulum?

- **High Season (Dec-Apr):** Perfect weather, but crowded and expensive.
- **Shoulder Season (May-Jun, Oct-Nov):** A great balance. You might see a short rain shower, but crowds are thinner and prices are better.
- **Low Season (Jul-Sept):** Hot, humid, and the rainiest period. Also, hurricane season. However, you'll find the lowest prices and smallest crowds.

### How many days do I need in Tulum?

- **3-4 Days:** Perfect for hitting the major highlights: ruins, a few cenotes, and beach time.
- **5-7 Days:** Ideal for a deeper experience, including multiple cenotes, a day trip to Coba or Akumal, and time to truly relax.

### What is the currency?

The local currency is the **Mexican Peso (MXN)**. While many places accept **US Dollars**, you will almost always get a worse **exchange rate**. It's best to pay in pesos. Credit cards are widely accepted in **hotel zones and restaurants**, but always carry cash for smaller shops, taxis, and entrance fees.

You can't miss the iconic Tulum Mayan ruins. What makes them unique is their stunning location perched on cliffs above the Caribbean Sea.

- **History:** Unlike most Mayan cities, Tulum was a major port and fortress. It was one of the last cities built and inhabited by the Maya.
- **What to See:** The main structure, El Castillo (The Castle), overlooks the sea. Don't miss the Temple of the Frescoes.
- **Pro Tips:**
  - GO EARLY. The gates open at 8 AM. Arrive by 7:45 AM to beat the tour buses and the intense heat.
  - Wear a swimsuit! After exploring, you can climb down the staircase to a small, beautiful beach below the cliffs for a swim.
  - Hire a guide at the entrance to truly understand the history, or do your research beforehand.
- **Day Trip to Coba:** For more ruins, head to Coba, located deeper in the jungle. You can still climb the immense Nohoch Mul pyramid, the tallest in the Yucatán Peninsula. Rent a bike or hire a bicycle taxi to explore the vast archaeological site.

- **Don't Touch Wildlife:** Look but don't touch. This is crucial for both your safety and the health of the animals, especially turtles in Akumal and marine life in cenotes.
- **Minimize Plastic Use:** Carry a reusable water bottle. Many hotels and restaurants have filtered water stations.
- **Respect the Ruins:** Do not climb on structures that are roped off. It's both dangerous and damaging to the ancient sites.

- **Biking:** The easiest and most fun way to get around the flat Hotel Zone. Rentals are cheap and everywhere.
