

## **Awesome Adventures Beyond the Beach**

#### 1. Take a Boat Trip to St. John

This is my top recommendation for a day trip. The island of St. John is right next door and is mostly a national park. The beaches there, like Trunk Bay, are arguably the most beautiful in the Caribbean. The ferry from Red Hook takes about 20 minutes and is an easy trip.

# 2. Explore Charlotte Amalie

The main town is full of history and color. Walk up the famous "99 Steps" for a great view and explore the duty-free shops for jewelry and souvenirs.

• My personal tip: Wear comfy shoes! The streets are charming but hilly.

# 3. Find a Quieter Beach

While I love Magens Bay, some of my best days were at smaller beaches. Sapphire Beach is gorgeous and great for snorkeling. Lindquist Beach is more secluded and feels like a hidden gem. Don't be afraid to explore!

## Free Things to Do in St. Thomas

You can have an amazing time without spending a dime!

- 1. **Hike to the top of Drake's Seat.** This is the famous curve in the road where Sir Francis Drake supposedly watched his fleet. The view of Magens Bay and the Atlantic is absolutely breathtaking and costs nothing. It's the perfect photo spot.
- 2. **Explore the Historic Streets of Charlotte Amalie.** Window shopping is free! I love wandering down the cobblestone alleyways like Palm Passage and Royal Dane Mall, admiring the old Danish colonial buildings. The vibrant Vendors Plaza is also fun to walk through.
- 3. **Snorkel at Brewers Bay.** While gear rental costs money, the underwater sightseeing is free! This beach, near the airport, has a great reef close to shore. I've seen sea turtles here! Just bring your own snorkel set.

# Things to Do in St. Thomas at Night

# **Helpful Tips From Someone Who's Been There**

- **Getting Around:** Taxis are easy to find but can be expensive for longer trips. If you're comfortable with it, renting a car gives you the most freedom. Just remember—they drive on the *left* side of the road here! It feels strange at first but you get used to it quickly.
- **When to Go:** The weather is sunniest from December to April, but that's also the most crowded and expensive time. I've found that May and November are also really lovely and a bit quieter.
- **Be Smart:** St. Thomas is very safe for tourists. Just use common sense. Don't leave your valuables unattended on your beach towel.

## **Answers to Common Questions**

#### What is the one thing you can't miss?

For me, it's a tie between the sunset from Paradise Point and swimming in the unbelievably blue water at Magens Bay.

#### Is it good for families?

Absolutely! It's a fantastic family destination. The beaches are calm, and kids love Coral World and the boat rides.

#### Do I need to carry a lot of cash?

Not really. Most places take credit cards. I just like to have some cash on hand for small vendors, tips, and local snacks.

#### Do I need a passport for St. Thomas?

If you're a U.S. citizen, **no passport is required!** 

#### Is St. Thomas safe for tourists?

Yes, especially in tourist areas. Still, use basic precautions—don't leave valuables unattended and avoid isolated places after dark.
